

BSA Guidelines

Groups limited to 50 people (outdoors).

Masks/Face coverings required when less than 6ft, and we promote wearing them full time.

Pre-Attending an Event:

- Anyone that has been knowingly in contact with someone with COVID-19, must not attend and recommended to self-quarantine for 14 days since exposure.
- Anyone that has tested positive for COVID-19 is forbidden to attend, until multiple negative tests over a proceeding 72 hours. Recommendation is distance maintained for multiple weeks.
- Anyone that has been sick or not feeling well, within the previous 72 hours of the event, is asked not to attend.
- Anyone sick at the time of the event, is asked not to attend.

Event Arrival:

- No mask, you go home. At this point, we are not offering masks on site.
- Each person must stop at the checkpoint: Temperature checked and must be below 99 degrees. Attendance is logged, with temperature (logs are going to be kept indefinitely).
- Hand sanitizer is made available at the checkpoint.
- Checkpoint person(s) are the same for the entire event.
- Questions may be asked, on how you are feeling and if you have any contact with anyone, etc.

During Event:

- Distance maintained during event as practically possible.
- When more than 6 ft, no masks are permitted for short period of times (drinking, eating, adjusting).
- People speaking to the large group, are more than 15 ft away, can remove mask while speaking.
- We minimize contact with our troop flags and material.
- Food/Drink, must be purchased and brought if needed. No cooking on site, and no community beverages.
- Blatant disregard for the rules and guidelines, is immediate removal from the event.
- Minor/Accidental/Common occurrences are addressed and mitigated, if continued. Removed from the event (or separated if removal not possible)
- Minimized interaction between patrols. (No Troop level activities during weekly meetings).
- Multiple adults are continuously monitoring youth.

When traveling:

- If not immediate household members, masks must be worn while in the vehicles.
- When returning, same vehicle assignment will be used (aka, youth can't switch to another car for the ride home).
- HIGHLY recommended that all transportation is done by live-in family member, but it is not required.

Procedures Post Event:

- If there is a report that an attendee of the event tests POSITIVE for COVID-19, all attendees at the same event up to two weeks in rear are informed... and suggested to self-quarantine and be tested.
- A positive tested individual may not return to the events, until having multiple negative tests over a minimum of 72 hours leading up to the event, and it is recommended to be negative for at least a week.
- If there is a report that an attendee of the event, may have been exposed to COVID-19, all individuals at the same event are notified, and recommended to remain self-quarantined until test results are completed, if positive, we follow the above procedures. If negative, we ask all connected persons to minimize contact, but not necessarily full self-quarantine.
